ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

At the age of 16, Fortunatus Nichols enlisted as a private in a Marlooro Company of Massachusetts Line commanded by Capt. Silas Gates in the regiment of Colonel Reid for a period of 6 months in July, 1770. Marched to Ticonderoga, went aboard the American fleet under General Benedict Arnold, served through the battle of Valcour Island and the destruction of the fleet, swam ashore with Arnold, and served the balance of his enlistment in the defense of Crown Point.
